Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein, pending entry of the Final Order, the Debtors are authorized, but not directed, in their sole discretion, to pay, remit, or reimburse, as applicable, not more than: (a) \$150,000.00 on account of any transfers to Employees (such limit not including payment of Reimbursable Expenses which are addressed separately herein); (b) \$21,220.00 on account of prepetition Withholding Obligations; (c) \$100,958.55 on account of Pre-Petition Employment Tax Obligations; (d) \$0.00 on account of prepetition Payroll Processing Fees; (e) \$5,000.00 on account of prepetition Reimbursable Expenses; and (f) \$270.00 on account of the prepetition Employee Benefits Programs.

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5. The Debtors are authorized, but not directed, to forward any unpaid amounts on account of Deductions or Payroll Taxes to the appropriate third-party recipients or taxing authorities in accordance with the Debtors' prepetition policies and practices.

6. The Debtors are authorized, but not directed, to pay costs and expenses incidental to payment of the Employee Compensation and Benefits obligations, including all administrative and processing costs and payments to outside professionals.

7.
