12 I currently serve as the Harold E. Kohn Chair and am a Professor of Law at Temple 13 University-Beasley School of Law. I teach (or have taught) Contracts, Bankruptcy, Corporations, 14 Commercial Law, Lawyering for Entrepreneurship, International Business Transactions, and a variety of other business law courses. My research focuses on corporate governance, restructuring, 15 16 and contracting practices. A significant focus of my scholarship is the nexus between bankruptcy 17 and religious liberty, such as my seminar "Debt and Democracy" (a study of bankruptcy and 18 constitutional law), and my articles When Churches Fail: The Diocesan Debtor Dilemmas, 79 S. 19 CAL. L. REV. 363 (2006) (cited in Blaudziunas v. Because of my experience, I am well-qualified to provide consulting and rebuttal expert
